Activities Covered:

Last week, we continued learning about **Community Helpers** and focused on non-emergency helpers such as teachers, postmen, chefs, and farmers. We learned that their roles are equally as important as the emergency helpers in helping our community.

In **Communication and Language**, we were introduced to the job of an engineer by listening to the story '**I Want to be an Engineer**'. Then we discussed the story and used a variety of materials to roleplay being building engineers by building different types of structures.

In **Literacy**, we learnt the last 2 sounds of the Jolly Phonics program which are **er**, and **ar**. We learnt the different sounds they make and learnt to blend new words and write words with them. We also learnt the High-frequency words, **the** and **was**.

In **Mathematics**, we were introduced to the topic of **1 more and 1 less**. To practice this new concept, we completed a various hands-on activity.

In **Personal, Social, and Emotional Development**, we explored all the other people who help us such as the chef who cooks food for us, the farmer who grows the food, the teachers who teach us in class how to read and write, a pilot takes us to another destination and more.

In **Physical Development**, we role-played being chefs. We made cheese and cucumber sandwiches for ourselves. We also made a chef's hat to play the part.

On Thursday, we came to school full of anticipation for our school trip to KidZania. We rode the bus with excitement and couldn't wait to get there.

Once we were there, we learned more about other professions and had so much fun roleplaying them.

We had a very busy, but it was filled with lots of fun!

Upcoming Activities:

This week, we will be exploring the theme of **People Coming and People Going**. We will focus on the different ways of travelling and what modes of transportation are needed to travel in various circumstances. We will share our travelling experiences too!

In **Communication and Language**, we will learn about the three different modes of transportation and will make different sensory bins to demonstrate land, sea, and air.

In **Literacy**, we will learn capital letters and writing sentences. We will learn the important rule of wiring sentences so they can be read clearly.

In **Mathematics**, we will have our final assessment for the year to evaluate what we know in all the topics we've learnt so far.

In **Understanding the World**, we will listen to the story '**Transportation - Then and Now**' and learn about the evolution of the means to travel over the years. We will also discuss and learn the importance of road safety and rules. We will learn the concept of traffic signals and how important they are for us to avoid accidents.

On Tuesday, we will be having the Qu'ran competition.
