In Literacy, we learned the phonics sounds **m** and **d**. We continued to learn how to write the sounds using the correct letter formation and identify words that have each of these sounds. We continued to blend words having the sounds we had already learned. The 'High-Frequency Words for last week, were 'it' and 'in". We practiced using them in oral sentences.

In Mathematics, we continued learning about shapes and focused on shapes with 5 and more sides. We learned their properties and how to differentiate between them. We also learned to build those shapes using various manipulatives.

In Understanding the World, we talked about 'My Family Roots'. we started a family tree which will be completed at home during the mid-term break and sent back when school opens on Sunday the 3rd of November.

On Thursday, we came to school dressed up as one of our family members. It was lots of fun having our mums joined us in class.

Upcoming Activities:
