Activities Covered:

Last week, we explored the magical world of plants, discovering This week, we will complete our theme of growing by focusing on how they grow and bring so much joy to our lives.

In Communication and Language, we listened to the story "My Family Helps and Protects Me." We learned how our family plays a key role in keeping us safe when we are playing online games.

In Personal, Social, and Emotional Development, we learned about the types of online games that are beneficial to our wellbeing and given the chance to make the right decisions by choosing appropriate games. In Understanding the World, we learned and discussed the parts of a flower. We then put our knowledge into practice by sequencing a sunflower plant made of recycled materials.

On Thursday, we put our green fingers to the test by planting beans in our class pot. Then we created a garden in a tray which we will watch grow in the days ahead. We will need to take care of our plants by practicing what we have learnt.
