Activities Covered:

animals. We kick started week 1 with learning all about **Zoo and** that live on a farm and the role of a farmer. Jungle animals.

In Communication and Language, we listened to and discussed the "Wake up Time on Bumble Farm". Then, we will sequence the story "Rumble in the Jungle" and the different habitat they live story in our own words and choose a farm animal to make as a in. We continued to practice using complete and well-formed ^{craft.} sentences to answer the questions asked.

In Personal, Social, and Emotional Development, we played a guessing game where we had to identify different zoo and jungle animals. Later, we completed an amazing artwork. First, we painted the background, and then we took our dried paint outside with rubber animals to trace their shadows on our background. We finished the activity by enhancing the background with natural leaves and sticks to make a habitat.

In Physical Development, we did a scavenger hunt in the school playground looking for posters of zoo animals. This was really fun!

In *Literacy*, we learnt the HFW's 'me' and 'we' and revised the letter sounds **q o u I f b**. We practiced blending and writing words with these sounds.

In Mathematics, we revised the number bonds 5-10 through various hands-on techniques.

In **Understanding the World**, we learnt about which animals are carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores and what is the meaning of each concept. Then we sorted the rubber animals according to the food they eat. Did you know that most humans are omnivores?

On Thursday, we dressed as different zoo animals to role-play the 'Dear Zoo' story. Then we matched the animals to the correct food that they would usually eat. It was great first week!
