Working in stages helps us to focus on our skills step by step and put it altogether as one final piece.

Activities Covered:

Last week, we learnt about the differences between animals that are active in the day and animals that are active in the night during the theme "Day/Night Animals".

In Communication and Language, we learnt new terminology to describe animals that move in the day (diurnal) and animals that move about at night (nocturnal). We did a good job differentiating between the different times of day when completing our craft.

In Personal, Social, and Emotional Development, we continued to work through the activities in the 'Your well-being is a Trust' initiative. This time there were some tempting treats for us to practice making good choices. It was a challenge, but we made it through the week.

In Mathematics, we focused on identifying missing numbers in sequence from 1 to 15. We practiced counting songs backward and forward to prepare for this activity. When your child is at find any of the numbers they have learnt.
